**Martin-Brower Announces Expansion in Prince William County**

**May 10, 2011, Prince William County, Virginia** – The Prince William Board of County Supervisors is pleased to announce food distributor Martin-Brower will expand in Prince William County, Virginia. The company announced its intent to consolidate its local workforce of 202 employees, add an additional 65 full-time employees, and invest \$32.2 million in new facilities to be constructed on Randolph Ridge Lane.

“The Board of County Supervisors and the citizens of Prince William County welcome Martin-Brower’s decision to expand here in Prince William County,” said Corey Stewart, Chairman of the Prince William Board of County Supervisors. “They had the opportunity to locate anywhere in the DC Metro Area, and we are pleased that they chose to remain a valued member of our business community. We look forward to working with them in the future as they continue to prosper and grow.”

“Quick access to our customers throughout the Baltimore-Washington market was an important consideration for us in selecting the right location for our business to grow,” said James V. Reyes, of Reyes Holdings LLC, the parent company of Martin-Brower. “Prince William County provides that access.”

“When we looked at all the factors, such as cost of doing business, quality of life for our employees, land availability, and the advantages of the County’s streamlined development process, Prince William County was the clear choice for our new facilities,” said Reyes.

“Due to our business-friendly development process and our location at the center of Northern Virginia’s Workforce, Prince William County is a leading location for business growth in the National Capital Region,” said Chairman Stewart. “Announcements like this one serve to underscore Prince William County’s reputation as an ideal community in which to live, work and play.”

According to the company, Martin-Brower intends to consolidate its two existing operations in Prince William County at new facilities totaling approximately 165,565 square feet. Construction is planned to begin in August of this year, with the company occupying the new location in August 2012.

“The new facilities will allow us to serve our customers and create exciting opportunities for future growth,” said Reyes.
